## **Engage**

Describe a time in your life when someone showed you great mercy. How did that affect your relationship?

Have someone briefly review what they remembered from the sermon

#### Learn

#### Read the Text

- 1. Read Matthew 5:3-10 which beatitude jumps out to you? Why is it significant to you today?
- 2. Read Matthew 5:7 how do you understand this verse?
- 3. Read Matthew 9:9-13. What does Jesus mean when he says, "I desire mercy, not sacrifice?"
- 4. Jesus told the Pharisees to "go and learn what this means: 'I desire Mercy, not sacrifice.'" How does someone go and learn this principle?

## Deepen

How would you describe mercy to your non-Christian friend? Can you explain it in terms of your own experience of mercy?

Pastor Keith said, "Mercy sees, then mercy does." What do you think the merciful see and then what do they do? Be specific and exhaustive.

What are some of the reasons you find it hard to be merciful to a stranger? What about someone you know who has hurt you?

What do you think being merciful accomplishes in this world?

### Live

In a moment of quiet prayer and journaling, take time to ask God two questions: Who do you want me to see? And What do you want me to do? Write down everything that comes to your mind.

How will you extend mercy to someone in need this week? Who are they? What will you do?

Spend time praying into these commitments, asking for his strength to be truly merciful.
