

4. Imitation is much more than flattery.

Paul urged us to imitate him... just as he imitates Christ (1 Cor. 4:16; 11:1) – and he urged all believers to be "imitators of God" (Eph. 5:1).

## DISCUSSION

- 1. Read the story of Shon Hopwood as reported by *Christianity Today*. What did you find most fascinating about his story? What effect did his story have on you esp. as it relates to your faith?
- 2. How and when and where do you think you may have experienced God this past week? What makes you think that it was an encounter with God?

## INTO THE BIBLE

- 1. We need to continually remind ourselves that our salvation is not earned or deserved but provided by God through His Son. Read Eph. 2:8-9. How are we saved?
- □ By the things we do
- □ By the things we do and by faith
- □ By faith alone
- 2. Paul says that we are to *work out our salvation with fear and trembling* (Phil. 2:12) and James says that *faith without deeds is dead* (Jas. 2:26). Compare these verses with Eph. 2:8-9.

## APPLICATION

Paul says, "...whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God" (1 Cor. 10:31). How does this verse apply to...

- Power
- □ Sports/Recreation

What might God be asking you to do (as a next step in your friendship with Him) that would bring Him glory? Why would doing so be a win-win?
