- 1. What does God invite us to in our marriages?
- a. Healthy Sexual Lives.
- 2. The husband should fulfill his marital duty to his wife, and likewise the wife to her husband. The wife's body does not belong to her alone but also to her husband. In the same way, the husband's body does not belong to him alone but also to his wife. Do not deprive each other except by mutual consent and for a time, so that you may devote yourselves to prayer. Then come together again so that Satan will not tempt you because of your lack of self-control (1 Cor. 7:3-5).

- b. Mutual Submission
- 4. Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord... Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church... (Eph. 5:21, 22, 25).

- a. Make disciples of children
- 6. Train a child in the way he should go... (Prov. 22:6).
- 7. These commandments that I give to you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up (Deut. 6:6-7).
- 8. *In everything set them an example by doing what is good. In your teaching show integrity, seriousness and soundness of speech* (Titus 2:7-8).

- 10. ...do not exasperate your children... (Eph. 6:4) and its echo in Col. 3:21: ...do not embitter your children, or they will become discouraged.
