A Meaningful Evening on Grief

Last Thursday some of us were treated to an evening with Mary Maxwell. Her poems spoke of the grief she has encountered over the course of her life. Her readings evoked memories for those of us in attendance who could relate to some of her experiences: to loving someone going through dementia; living with two thrill seeking siblings who grew up to have struggles with addiction, who died in separate alcohol related accidents; the loss of her dear mother, to a patient who is misunderstood by nursing staff unfamiliar with her former self and life. Mary gently began the conversation about grief and healing. She encouraged us to choose one of the river stones laid out on a table that represented our grief. She instructed us in several movements and questions to consider and to journal thoughts and feelings. Then we were invited to think about what we needed to do with our grief going forward. Some of us gave our grief to God, others took our grief with us for more work and others left their grief behind for the time being. We are hoping to have Mary back next year to repeat this session. If you would like to participate in this worthwhile session please let one of us know.
