# HE PAID THE PRICE

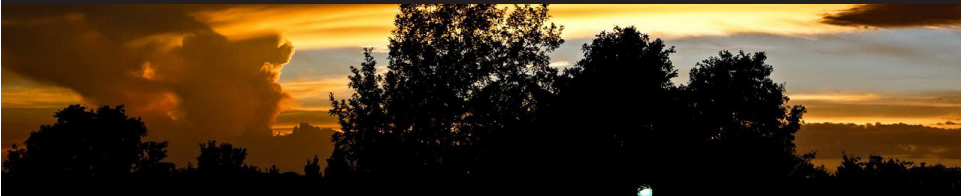
# **WHAT IS SALVATION?**

## **You are a new creation**

follower of Christ:

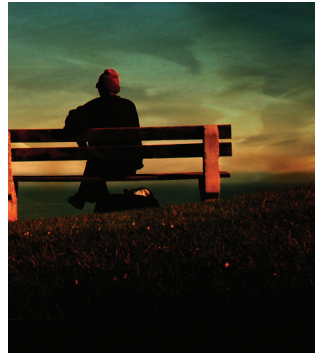


# THE PROMISE OF SALVATION

---

The first promise is the promise of salvation. God has forgiven us and saved us from the punishment we deserved.

# THE PROMISE OF FORGIVENESS

The second promise is the promise of forgiveness. Even when we are trying to follow Jesus we still screw up. The important thing to understand is that following Jesus is a process of transformation that takes place over time. There are a lot of new things to learn and new habits to develop.

Fortunately God has promised that nothing can ever separate us from him. Whenever we come to him and humbly ask forgiveness for our mistakes He has promised to forgive us and make us pure.





# THE PROMISE OF HIS PRESENCE

The third promise is the promise of his presence. No matter what happens, once we put our lives into God's hands God will never leave or abandon us. God has said that there is no one who can pluck us from his hand, and no power in heaven above or hell below that can separate us from his love. Guaranteed.

Will we always feel his presence or be consciously aware that he is here with us? No we won't. But, once again, we put our trust in God and what he has said in his word, not in our mood of the day.

# GO TO CHURCH

---

One of the first steps we take is we start attending church and meet together regularly with others who have put their trust in Christ. According to what God has said in the Bible, we are now part of God's family. And just like a good family, it is important to spend time together, learn from each other, and look out for one another.

When we start going to church and meet with others in smaller groups to discover what God has to teach us, we get the support and information we need to begin the exciting process of spiritual transformation and growth.



# **PRAY EVERYDAY**

Another step we need to take is learning to talk to God on a regular basis. If we want to develop a deeper relationship with someone – we kind of need to talk to them – the more often the better.

Prayer is simply talking to God. We can talk to him about anything, in any place, and at any time. There are three types of conversations we should have with God to get us started:

# **1 Prayer of thankfulness**

The first is a prayer of thankfulness and gratitude. This is simply telling God how happy you are for who he is, what he has done, and what he has promised to do.

# **2 Prayer of forgiveness**

The second is a prayer of forgiveness. While we are growing spiritually we are going to screw up. When we do it's always good to come clean with God, ask for forgiveness, and renew our decision to follow his path instead of our own.

# **3 Prayer of help**

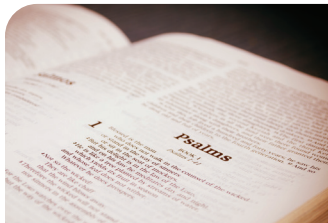
The third is a prayer of help. When we need help for healing, wisdom, or anything else we can turn to God. Will he always give us help exactly the way we want it? No. Sometimes he answers "yes", sometimes "no", and sometimes "wait". But he always answers. Out of love and what he knows is best for us in the long run.

# READ YOUR BIBLE

---

If prayer is talking to God, reading your Bible is allowing God to talk to us. If we are going to follow God's leading in our lives then it's pretty important to listen to his instructions.

Of course, the Bible is a pretty big book and it's hard to know where to start.

The Bible is divided into two parts. Books that were written before the time of Jesus are called the Old Testament, and books written during the time of Jesus are called the New Testament. While both are good, it's probably best to start reading the New Testament first.

To learn more about the life of Jesus try reading the Gospel of John. The letters of 1st John, 1st Peter, and Philippians are good places to start to learn about living the Christian life. The book of Proverbs is a good place to learn about wisdom, and the book of Psalms is a good place to learn about prayer.



Because of the way the Bible was written, it is usually best to read it only a paragraph or two at a time and then sit and think about what it means and how to apply that to your life. You can also read the Bible with another Christian, or even a group of Christians, in order to understand it more fully.

# GET BAPTIZED

---

Another important first step is something called baptism. Back in Jesus' day, people would get baptized on the very first day they decided to follow Jesus. While we don't have to be in a panicked rush, it is still something important to do right away.

What is baptism?

It's basically getting dunked in a tank of water.

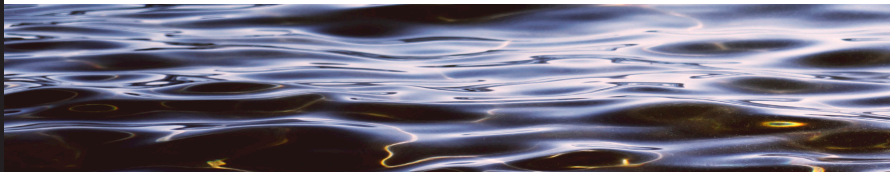
Why do we get baptized?

Because Jesus asked us to. If we are truly following Jesus lead in our lives we will do what he asks and get baptized just as Jesus himself was baptized.

# What does baptism mean?

Baptism is an outward symbolic act that represents an inward spiritual reality. The waters of baptism represent the grave. Going down into the water represents dying to your old way of living. Rising up out of the water represents rising up into your new life of following Jesus.

It's pretty cool.



# **SPIRITUAL GROWTH**

Once we've taken our first few baby steps in following God's lead in our lives it's time to start growing bigger, stronger, and faster. The Christian life isn't just life changing, it's world changing!

One of the most important things to remember is that we don't follow Jesus all alone. The Holy Spirit of God, yes, God himself, comes and lives within us!

The Spirit of God is always with us and he will always help us when we ask. He's always there to give you guidance, strength, and encouragement throughout your life.

However, there is a big difference between having God's Holy Spirit within you, and actually paying him any attention. That's why God instructs us to "be filled with the Holy Spirit". What does that mean? Well, being filled with the Holy Spirit is kind of like being filled with music. We can have music on in the background and completely ignore it. However, if we intently listen to the music, surrender to it, and allow it to fill us – the music will move us. We'll tap our feet, bob our heads, and even dance.

To be filled with the Holy Spirit we do sort of the same thing - we listen to him, we surrender to him, and allow him to fill us. When we do, the Holy Spirit will move us. But instead of tapping our toes our lives will produce peace, joy, love, kindness, patience, self-control and more!

He may even grant us special spiritual gifts to enable us to make a bigger and more positive impact in our world. Some will be able to pray with a special boldness, others will be able to be leaders, still others will be able to pray for the sick. These gifts are a wonderful new way to serve and experience God in our lives.
