Ninth Indigenous Anglican Sacred Circle

The Ninth Indigenous Anglican Sacred Circle was held August 6-11, 2018 on the campus of the University of Northern British Columbia in Prince George, B.C.

The theme for this Sacred Circle is "Making and Strengthening Disciples: Reborn in Water and Spirit," Matthew 28:19-20.

The Indigenous Anglican Sacred Circle is the national gathering and decision-making body for Indigenous Anglicans in Canada. Since 1988, First Nations, Métis and Inuit members of local Anglican churches have gathered every three years to talk about our spiritual lives, past and present experiences, our hopes for the future and our relationships with the Anglican Church of Canada.

Delegates have been selected either by the bishops of dioceses with "significant Indigenous ministry" or the diocesan committee/council on Indigenous ministry. Numbers of delegates from each area have been determined by the Anglican Council of Indigenous Peoples. Archbishop Melissa selected our Parishioner and Elder Rene Inkster to attend. The Ninth Indigenous Anglican Sacred Circle will continue the journey toward self—determination and becoming an Indigenous church within the Anglican Church of Canada.

It shows the cheque, in the amount of \$3,500.00, being received by Joy & Judy on behalf of All Saints Church. These funds were given by Vancity through their Community Partnership Program towards the cost of the Solar Panel Upgrade at the Church.

Solar Panel Upgrade

All the funding for the Solar Panel Upgrade has been received. We received grants from the Diocese of New Westminster, Vancity, an 'in-kind' donation from Vancouver Renewable Energy, and All Saints Anglican Church. A plaque will be prepared to recognize all the donors to this project.

The contract with Vancouver Renewable Energy (VREC) runs from July 17, 2018 to October 1, 2018 (this may be extended if necessary). The first instalment has been paid towards this project. On Thursday, August 23rd, we heard from Rob Baxter of VREC, that all the equipment has been ordered and that the installation to upgrade the solar panels could start in a week or two.

We will be looking at holding a joint Educational Forum with Vancity next Spring regarding 'environmental stewardship and sustainability' which will include the results of our solar panel upgrade installation. Elevator Project

Our funding goal for the 'Elevator Project' (Lift) has been reached. Jesus told us how to do it. Jesus, said, "Whatever you do for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you do it for me." That means when we feed someone who is hungry, it is the same as doing it for Jesus. When we visit someone who is sick, it is the same as doing it for Jesus. When we give clothes to those who are in need, it is the same as doing it for Jesus.

There is a very special name for this way of saying, "Thank you." I call it "thanks living." "Thanks living" is when we show our thanks by the way we live. "Thanks living" is when we look at the many ways God has blessed us, and we thank him by being a blessing to others.

Let's pray and ask God to help us to offer our thanksgiving by "thanks living."

Our Father, we come into your presence with thanksgiving. Help us to turn our thanksgiving into "thanks living." In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
