Today we're beginning the process of appointing Sherwin Mackintosh and Harold Channer as elders of the congregation. Both of these men have served in many different leadership roles in the church over the years, demonstrating their humility and servant hearts time and time again. The current leadership group of the church, consisting of the elders, evangelists, and other key senior leaders, is confident in Sherwin's and Harold's ability and desire to serve as elders, and in the congregation's support for them in that role.



Sherwin Mackintosh was baptized in 1972 as a freshman at the University of Florida, where Tom Brown was his first Bible talk leader.

Sherwin started working in the ministry part-time as a student and soon met his wife, Debbie, before getting married in 1979.

After the birth of his daughter Carrie, and receiving his Master's Degree in Music at the New England Conservatory in Boston, Sherwin and Debbie were asked to serve in the ministry in New York City. Soon after their move, their son Chase was born.

In New York, Sherwin and Debbie helped in the formation of the Arts Region, which grew tremendously, baptizing hundreds of aspiring actors, many performing in Broadway shows, the Metropolitan Opera, as well as TV and movies. Sherwin and Steve Johnson began writing together and soon created *Upside Down* (a musical based on the book of Acts) and *Slingshot* (based on the life of David).

Steve and Sherwin also wrote many songs including "I Hear God Singing To Me" and "Men Who Dream" that have been translated and sung in many congregations around the world. Both Chase and Carrie were baptized in the Teen Ministry, while Debbie was appointed a Women's Ministry Leader in New York in 1994, and Sherwin was appointed an Elder in 1999.

In 2003, Sherwin and Debbie moved back to Gainesville, FL to pursue Sherwin's doctorate in music, and he was immediately offered a job to be the director of the new PK Yonge Performing Arts Center with the Department of Education at University of Florida. Sherwin helped to build a nationally acclaimed arts program there, and it was there that Chase met Sarah Dardis, who later became a Christian, as well as her mom, dad, and brother Michael. Debbie served as a Women's Ministry Leader at the Gainesville Christian Church and Sherwin as an Elder.

In 2012, Sherwin and Debbie answered the call to go back into the full-time ministry at the North River Church of Christ. They have served in the Youth & Family, Creative Arts and Worship Ministries, and currently oversee the Northwest Community. At North River, they are surrounded by their children and five grandchildren (and another one on the way), where Chase and Sarah are on staff, and Carrie's husband, Jason, was recently appointed to the North River Board of Directors. Sherwin and Debbie are honored to serve alongside their original mentors, Tom and Kelly Brown, and humbled to be asked to serve in this new role.



Harold Channer was baptized on December 22nd of 1991, his freshman year in college. He soon served as a Bible Talk leader in the growing campus ministry in the New York City Church of Christ.. Harold then started serving in the music ministry



as a song leader and as a part of the sound team. Harold met Jerri while they both were in the campus ministry in New York City. They served together as campus leaders and then helped serve in the Queens Teen Ministry. They were married in 1996 and continued to serve as teen leaders to one of the fastest-growing teen ministries in the country at that time.

After moving to Tampa, FL, the Channers were actively involved in the Tampa Church of Christ Children's Ministry as well as serving as Teen Ministry leaders. Their jobs took them to Atlanta with two young rambunctious toddler boys - AJ (2.5 years old) and Aaron (6 months old). They began actively leading a small group and serving in the children's ministry. Harold was later appointed as a deacon and board member at Marietta Christian Church (later known as Bridge Pointe).

Ten years ago, when the Channers moved to North River, they began to see a vision for their young sons through each life stage ministry from children's ministry to campus. They have served here in the children's ministry and have also built strong relationships with many campus ministry young men facilitating mentorship for their "tween" sons. Harold and Jerri have been leading a growing Family Group for many years since they came to North River. Their Family Group has multiplied several times, raising up new leaders to lead other groups in Woodstock, Kennesaw, and Acworth. Harold was appointed NR's deacon of Family Groups five years ago and has also actively served alongside Jerri in the Youth & Family ministry.

Harold currently serves as a member of the North River Board of Directors. Harold and Jerri are proud of the serving hearts of their sons, now 17 and 15, who are striving to be like Jesus by starting a High School Bible Talk at their home. Harold and Jerri are true servants that love Jesus and the North River family and the Channers are honored to be asked to serve in this way.



The Spiritual Importance of Elders

Elders are responsible for shepherding the flock, which means looking over the spiritual well-being of the congregation. This includes making sure the church is being fed spiritually, that its members are growing spiritually, and that the church is protected from those who would cause it harm. Elders also oversee or manage the congregation, either directly or through the board of directors and church employees.

In fulfilling these responsibilities, elders must live an exemplary spiritual life, lead their families well and lead spiritually within the congregation. Before a man can be appointed as an elder in accordance with the Scriptures, he must:

<u>Be Biblically Qualified</u>: He conforms to the qualities established in Scripture. Some key passages containing biblical qualities are in I Timothy Chapter 3, Titus Chapter 1, and I Peter Chapter 5.

- •<u>Be Capable of Fulfilling an Elder's Responsibilities</u>: He is spiritually, emotionally, mentally, and physically capable of doing the work, and he has the time and capacity to undertake the work.
- •Be a Committed Disciple: He is a man full of the Spirit, having demonstrated his love for God and man in the way he has conducted his life, both privately and publicly.
- <u>Have a Character that is Above Reproach</u>: There must not be anything in his life discrediting his leadership or disgracing the church.
- •<u>Desire to Serve as an Elder:</u> The role of elder is not an honorary position. It is a difficult and demanding role within the church, requiring much time, energy, and hard work. An elder must willingly embrace the demands of his role.

After much prayer and petition, the leadership group believes these men are capable of fulfilling these responsibilities and are biblically qualified to be appointed as elders. Since these men will be leading and serving the whole congregation, however, we desire your input as members of the congregation before we proceed with their appointment. We would like you to reach out to the current elders and evangelists with your thoughts regarding the eldership in general, and these men in particular. We also encourage you to approach these men and get to know them. Thank you to all our members for being such a joy to lead. We are humbled and honored.

Every winter and spring break, North River families and small groups share meals (perishable and non-perishable food items) with food insecure families identified by Marietta City Schools





Facilities and Requests

The challenge to fit and arrange all that the membership wants to do on our campus continues!

As good stewards of all that God gives us, let us keep the following in mind:

- Treat the buildings as though they are your home. (They are!)
- To request a spot on the North River campus, please go to nrcoc.org, click on Resources and select Facility Request (http://nrcoc.org/facility-request/). Easily fill out and submit our new form from a phone or laptop.
- All private events for members weddings, birthday or grad parties, showers, etc., will incur charges.
- HVAC systems (there are six in the FLC) are programmed on Mondays for the week. That means that all requests should be in at least by the Friday of the week before your event. Most requests are processed within 48 hours.
- Don't assume all rooms are available to use if they are empty. You may get booted or those rooms may be considered off limits such as some children's ministry or staff rooms.
- Bear with each other if you don't get your desired spot – or for the time you need it. Until we get more space, flexibility is key!
- Reminder! The FLC is a NUT-FREE facility. Please keep this in mind when bringing lunch or potluck meals. Thank you for keeping those with serious food allergies safe.

Do You Have Trouble Hearing the Service?

FRONT-ROW HEARING NOW INSTALLED!!

North River installed a hearing loop system to deliver clear sound to users of hearing aids or cochlear implants and others who have hearing loss. The hearing loop is installed under the carpet in a section on the left side of the auditorium. Please see an usher to identify which seats are within the loop. In this section, any telecoil-equipped hearing device (most hearing aids, all cochlear implants, and some personal receivers) can receive a clear transmission of the message and music without background noise

If your hearing device has a telecoil, then use your telecoil input when sitting in the looped section. If you do not have a hearing device with a telecoil and need hearing assistance, request a receiver from an usher, and sit in the looped section.
