## James 1:19-21 - Anger

- To have "no anger" is wrong (Ephesians 4:26).
  - God and Jesus have both become angry many times but yet they are both completely without sin (Mark 3:5, Deuteronomy 1:34).
- To have "blow anger" is wrong (James 1:19-20).
- We should have "slow anger" (James 1:29).
- Anger at its core is love. It is love in motion towards a threat against that which you love.
  - Anger can be a righteous thing when it is motivated by love for God and others.
  - Anger can also be a cancerous sin when it is motivated by love for self.
  - A test to discover if your anger is righteous or sinful: simply ask yourself this question "who am I defending?"
- The remedy for sinful anger is to accept "the word" with humility (James 1:21).
  - "The word" is the good news that on the cross Jesus absorbed both our anger and God's anger.
  - How great is our God that he would take His own justified anger on Himself because He so unimaginably loves us?
