## Messy: Joining God in the Mess

## **Boundaries**

- Essentially, boundaries are about responsibility. They
  define what I am responsible for and what I am not
  responsible for.
  - A great example of a boundary is to look at the first boundary ever created: the boundary of the fruit in the Garden of Eden (Genesis 2:16–17).
- Why should we have boundaries?
  - We need to know limits or we live in chaos.
- How exactly do boundaries work?
  - We are not responsible *for* others; we are only responsible *for* ourselves but are responsible *to* others.
  - We are responsible to carry the <u>burdens</u> of others and for our own <u>loads</u> (Gal 6:2-5).
  - We also must keep in mind that we are only responsible for what is within our ability to do (Prov 3:27 & Rom 12:18).
- What do properly functioning boundaries look like?
  - The story of the Good Samaritan is a perfect example (Luke 10:25–37).
  - Christians must take into account the law of compassion.
