Boundaries

- Essentially, boundaries are about responsibility. They define what I am responsible for and what I am not responsible for.
 - A great example of a boundary is to look at the first boundary ever created: the boundary of the fruit in the Garden of Eden (Genesis 2:16–17).
- Why should we have boundaries?
 - We need to know limits or we live in chaos.
- How exactly do boundaries work?
 - We are not responsible **for** others; we are only responsible **for** ourselves but are responsible **to** others.
 - We are responsible **to** carry the burdens of others and **for** our own loads (Gal 6:2-5).
 - We also must keep in mind that we are only responsible for what is within our ability to do (Prov 3:27 & Rom 12:18).
- What do properly functioning boundaries look like?
 - The story of the Good Samaritan is a perfect example (Luke 10:25–37).
 - Christians must take into account the law of compassion.
