Mark 6:30-44



1. What insight, observation, or question do you have from this week's reading plan?
2. What insight, principle or observation from this week's message did you find to be most helpful, eye opening or troubling? Please explain.
3. Share about a time when you felt like you were in over your head, when you felt inadequate. Share about a time when you felt God calling you to something that you felt was beyond your ability.
4. Read Mark 6:30-44. What do you think the disciples thought and felt when Jesus told them to feed the crowd?
5. The disciples made some excuses as to why they couldn't. What were they? Were their excuses reasonable? What excuses do you often use when you feel God call you to do something? Are they reasonable? (Assuming the answer is yes) So then, why does God still call you?
6. God loves to show His power by using the weak and inadequate. Share stories of people you know, either from history or from Scripture, who display this truth.
7. Why is it hard for us to take "our little" and add it to "God's greatness"? (i.e. steps of faith, we focus on ourselves rather than Him, focus on the size of the problem or call rather than on the size of our God...)
8. Presently, what is God calling you to join Him in as He moves his kingdom forward (leading, starting an initiative, sharing the gospel, serving, hospitality...)? What are your excuses?
9. Pray for each other. Pray each other's excuses away!
