ADVENT GIVING 2016

Improved Agronomic Practices

For 11 years we have partnered with Food for the Hungry in a sustainable development program affecting almost 30,000 people in the Sasiga region of Ethiopia. FH works with churches, leaders and families to improve health, supply clean water, create agricultural and economic options, increase education for all, gender empowerment, and environmental restoration. Lambrick has seen 110 children sponsored which alongside our missions giving provides \$70,000 annually. Excitingly we are continuing support as the team relocates 30km and starts to bring hope to a further 25,000 people in the 'Highlands' area. In early 2017 the first region 'graduates' and we will go and celebrate with them, and see the new work being started.

This year we have chosen to support the **Promotion of Improved Agronomic Practices (\$6000)** including sustainable agricultural development, composting, diversification and bio-intensive training for hundreds of farmers. It will also target economic empowerment for women through vegetable and fruit production.

PRAYER MATTERS

This week we are praying for **Food for the Hungry,** our missions partner.

Giving Thanks: As the Sasiga Lowlands area prepares to graduate we are thankful for the many impacts of FH programs and the many communiy leaders who are now taking full control of their communities' development. Nine new wells were completed in the Mid Highlands area this past year in various communities bringing clean water to within 1.5 kms of 511 households. **Prayer:** Political unrest in the country has brought about tightened security which has restricted movement and gathering of groups. Some FH programs are being affected. FH staff will complete the transition from the Lowlands to the Mid Highlands this year. This is bittersweet as so much has been accomplished in the past 10 years but close friendships have also formed. In many ways it is difficult for the staff to leave. As we scale up programs in the Mid Highlands please pray for staff as they build trust with community leaders and members, for enthusiastic community participation, and openness to a new worldview.
