

The White Gift tradition shares the spirit of hope, love, joy and peace at Christmas. We give gifts of love to people needing sustenance, love and support. These gifts are often nonperishable food items which are distributed to people in the community. White Gift Sunday celebrates the stewardship of compassion and extends God's love beyond our own community.
