*(This popular Anglican Advent Carol is rightly and wrongly attributed to the great hymn writer Charles Wesley, brother of the infamous John Wesley. In the modern world the words appear foreign and otherworldly. They are an articulation of the apocalyptic language and theology of the Book of Revelation in which the author sought to instill hope in the hearts of those who were oppressed, dehumanized and where injustice ruled. It is a hymn of hope that evil and injustice would be replaced with goodness and justice.)*
